Orphan Kitten Club is a not-for-profit organization focused on saving the lives of orphan kittens that were abandoned at birth. Orphan Kitten Club was founded in 2018 and is the first 501(c)3 charitable organization dedicated to rescuing orphaned kittens through hands-on kitten care, fostering and advocacy. We are currently based in San Diego, California.

OUR FOUNDER

She has over 10 years of experience in the field of animal rights advocacy, particularly for cats both big and small. WHY ORPHANED KITTENS?

During the spring and summer seasons of every year, most unsterilized cats go into heat and give birth to litters of kittens. When this happens, shelters are inundated with kittens that were rescued off the streets, often found without their mothers. Kittens found in their early stages require heightened care that many shelters are unable to provide due to understaffing and lack of resources, hence they are usually the first to be euthanized. Orphan Kitten Club aims to reduce the killing of neonatal kittens, especially those found in shelters, and to give every kitten a fair shot at a meaningful life.

OUR PROGRAMS

Apart from providing hands-on kitten rescue and care in our fully equipped kitten nursery, we also run two other programs:

- **Mightycat Program:** A grant program where we provide funds to non-profit organizations that share our vision in caring for neonatal kittens and allowing them to thrive.
- **Full Circle TNR:** A Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) program that aims to end the cycle of reproduction that causes kittens to be born outdoors, leading to their abandonment and eventual surrender to animal shelters. Our TNR program ensures that the community cats are sterilized in a safe and humane manner, ending the cycle of abandonment and eventual killing of neonatal kittens in shelters.
